#### PLANNING RUBRICS FOR ORALS

Rubrics for any kind of assessment should highlight – what students can do rather than what they cannot do.

No rubric will necessarily suitable for every student because every student is unique.

A teacher is responsible to assign the rating which most closely fits the students's actual performance.

In order to prepare the rubrics, a teacher must clearly know the purpose of the activity and the students too should be made aware of the purpose of the particular assessment activity.

Secondly, the nature of expected performance of the student must be clear.

The criteria for each task must be clearly and properly set. Without such clarity of criteria, the task remains merely a set of instructions.

Thus, rubrics can be revised on the basis of the expected objectives may vary. The assessor can raise the difficulty level if he/she finds his/her students to be more promising.

Rubrics are necessary for assessment of any learning skills.

Teachers need to find time to observe students and document their performance.

Speaking means negotiating intended meaning and adjusting one's speech to produce the desired effect on the listener.

In simple words, it means, clarifying one's own intentions to the closest match between intended, perceived and anticipated meanings.
