### *From the Principal's Desk*



- **Preliminaries**

Gender that determines the status of human beings in social life since every society has its roots and branches on the basis of sexual categories. There are some characteristics ascribed to the masculine and feminine faculties and accordingly their abilities, capacities and psychological features have been observed. For ages, there have been the struggles and conflicts which inflicted some restraints or regulatory systems. Thereafter norms, behaviours and roles associated with being a woman, man, girl or boy, and relationships with each other have been provided. It is a social construct. Depending on the context, these characteristics may include biological, sex-based social structures or gender roles. There are the gender identities.

- **Gender audit : A Process**

Gender audit is an evaluation process in which we are going to verify whether the implemented policies or involvements are proper and which steps of progress are possible. It is a self-assessment of ourselves. It is also monitoring and evaluation of issues and efforts. During the initial planning of the audit, an analysis was conducted to identify, evaluate and prioritize the risk associated with Gender issues on the basis of the academic and socio-cultural records of the last two years. The analysis was based upon an examination of the policies, manuals, and standards that govern the gender sustainability; it is the data analysis.

- **Infrastructural and Mentoring Facilities**

The College ensures the safety of students. 25 CCTV cameras are installed on the campus and all porches and passages of classrooms, laboratories and library. The security



guards are placed at college gates. There is a separate washroom for girls with a lady caretaker. Ladies common room is taken care of by a lady peon. Counselling of students is done by teachers. 'Mentor- Mentee' system has been introduced. Mentors motivate students to approach them for help and support of all kinds. Counsellors include lady teachers and that makes it easier for girls to express themselves freely. A Ladies teacher accompanies students on field visits or study tours and the NSS camping programme. The lectures on the diet and nutrition and Health Camp are organized for the girl students with the association of Dr. Vasantrao Pawar Medical College and Research Centre and the PHC Ghoti. Ladies Common Room, Clean Wash Rooms are available. Sanitary Napkin Vending Machine is installed in Ladies Common Room. Anti-Ragging Cell, Ladies Forum and Ladies Redressal Cell are formed for ensuring 'free and safe environment' for girl students. The grievances, received from the ladies staff and students are redressed. The Ladies Forum works to build gender sensitized atmosphere in the college. Programme like self-defense technique, Leadership Development Workshops and lectures, Legal and Sex Education are conducted by the Ladies Forum, Students Development Council and NSS unit. They are made aware issues like sexual harassment at working place, issues of transgender etc.

In short, to identify gaps and challenges in the policy and to receive some suggestions for redressing them is aimed at.

#### • Mechanism for Management and Governance

The college has separate committees such as Discipline Committee, Students Development Council, NSS Committee, Sports and Gymkhana Committee, Ladies Redressal Cell, the Cultural Activities Committee etc. All these are headed by the Chairpersons or Coordinators and student representatives also work hand in hand with the faculty; and so administration is made student-oriented. The regular activities of all these are presented in detail in the respective sections in the project.

As a head of the institution, I assure that the committees and schemes implemented for the students and especially for the girls are properly coordinated and conducted. The college is becoming the secured and comfortable place for self education and human values through the practices of total education. We expect the valuable guidelines and suggestions for augmentation and improvement.

## INTRODUCTION

This college was established in 1980 and it is only 45 Kilometers away from the famous historical, religious holy place Nashik and 6 kilometers away from the famous **Dhamma Giri Vipassana International Academy**, Igatpuri. A very famous educational institute in Maharashtra, Maratha Vidya Prasarak Samaj, Nashik is the parent institute that manages the college. Being affiliated to Savitribai Phule University Pune, this college has been a recognized college under the section 2(F) and 12 (B) of the UGC Act 1953. Our college has been evaluated by the NAAC regularly upto three cycles and has secured its deserving awards of “B” , ‘B+,’ and ‘B’ Grade respectively.

The Gender Audit is an attempt to study good gender balance. Similarly to study whether college follows all the University rules, policies & action because it forms a constituent part of the University. This Gender Audit tries to check the impact of its current & proposed policies on Gender equality. The college always concentrates on the overall personality development of all students. Observing the Gender equality the girls are provided various facilities and special attention.

The unit always motivates the girls for their social responsibilities and empowerment. For safety, separate two-wheeler parking, cycle stand and study room are provided to girls. To make the girls aware of their rights and to impart knowledge of bylaws counseling through lectures by legal advisers are arranged. These lectures are arranged every year by Ladies Forum and Redressal Cell for women & Anti-Ragging Committee. In the department of cultural activities & sports, girls achieved grand success. Their active participation in ‘Yuwaspandan’ as Youth Festival and various competitions shows their ability and achievements.





## **The Objectives of Gender Audit**

The following objectives have been stated and accordingly planned during the last two years.

- To observe the gender equality at all levels of faculty, staff and students.
- To implement the strategies of the college towards satisfying needs and interests of men and women on the campus.
- To provide equal opportunities and roles in decision making processes in all areas of the college activities.
- To suggest measures for bridging the gender gap if any.
- To promote harmony through gender equality in all aspects.
- To sensitize the students and the staff for prevention and prohibition of sexual harassment at work place.
- To provide a candid stress free college environment for all.





## **Activities for Gender Sensitization**

In every corner of system gender sensitive features are carefully observed. Gender equality has been kept updated by forming the committees like 1) Anti-ragging, 2) Ladies Forum and 3) Redressal Cell for Women at work place and providing adequate facilities for girls.

**1) Earn and Learn scheme:** - For the uplift and empowerment our college provides student oriented schemes like Earn and Learn scheme. The students are selected on the basis of economic poverty and their needs. The selection is made through proper procedure stepwise: Applications—scrutiny—interviews keeping gender equality in view. The payment is given as per clock hour basis. Mostly girls are working in library. Prof. R. M. Ambekar from Economics Department always makes jobs available to the students.

### **2) Safety Facilities:**

A] Entrance: For safety measurements for girls and to avoid chaotic situation a security is made available.

B] Parking facility: A well observed separate parking for two wheelers and bicycles for girls is one of the disciplines in our college.

C] Study Room: Separate study room compartments in the library leads to excellent performance of girls.

D] Book issuing schedules are laid down for issuing which marks discipline.

E] Ladies Common Room and Wash Room: Ladies Common Room provision is made for girls. A notice board is placed in Ladies Common Room which displays notices specific for female students. Clean and hygiene Wash Rooms are available with ample water supply. Women faculty members take care of girls wherever necessary. Women faculty provides sanitary napkins if necessary and a Sanitary Napkin Vending Machine is also installed in ladies room, girls



can purchase a sanitary napkin at just Rs. 5. A separate wash room is provided for female faculty members.

F] Drinking Water: A separate drinking Water facility is there for girls.

G] Canteen: Canteen facility is available in campus where a separate compartment is for girls.

H] Health Camp: Every year Health camps & Blood donation camps are arranged by NSS & Students Development Council. For that Red Ribbon Club and P. H. C. Ghoti works jointly.

**3) Anti-Ragging and Discipline Committee:** The College publishes its regulations in prospectus as well as in college campus. Ragging is criminal offence and UGC has notified Regulations on curbing the means of Ragging in highly educational institutions in order to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging. The college has its Anti-Ragging and Discipline committee, as per the University guidelines. These committees are having female and male members and reports on six monthly basis.

**4) NSS Unit:** NSS unit has 250 volunteers in which about 45% to 50% are girls. Every year a Special Winter Camp is organized to inculcate students with the importance of nature in rural areas.

**5) Students' Welfare Unit:** This unit is responsible for spreading awareness among students regarding life values and learning various life skills. The details of the programs organized by this unit are furnished in separate section of this report.

**6) NCC Unit:** National Cadet Corp Unit train students for physical fitness and various disciplines of national defense system. Both boys and girls can seek admission for this course. After successful completion students can join various defense units of the country.

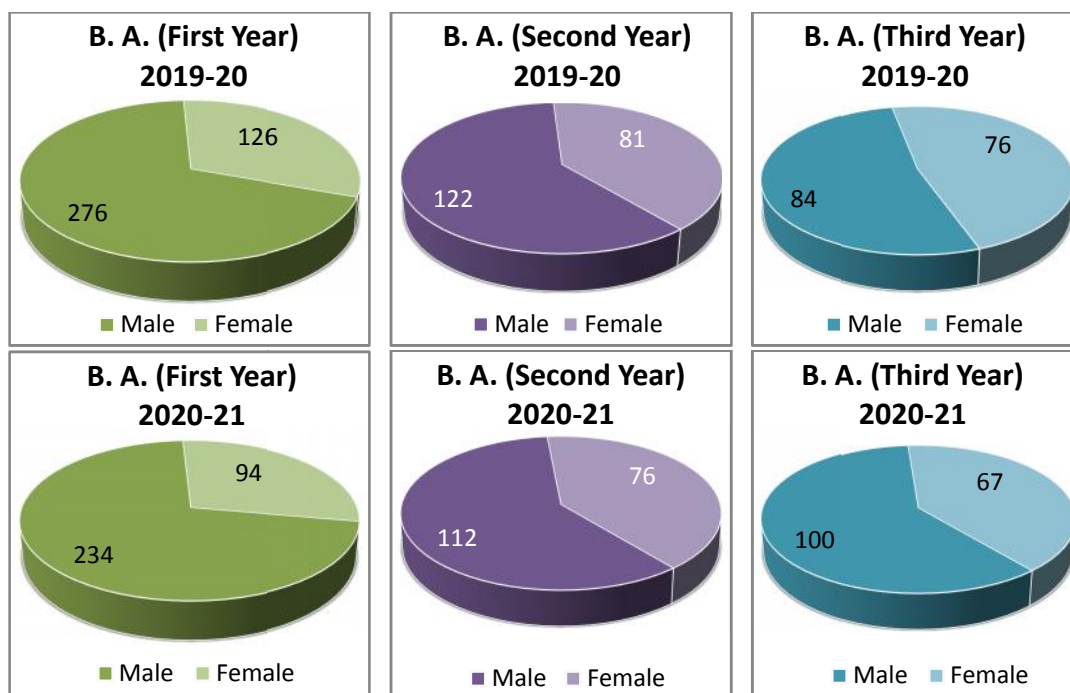

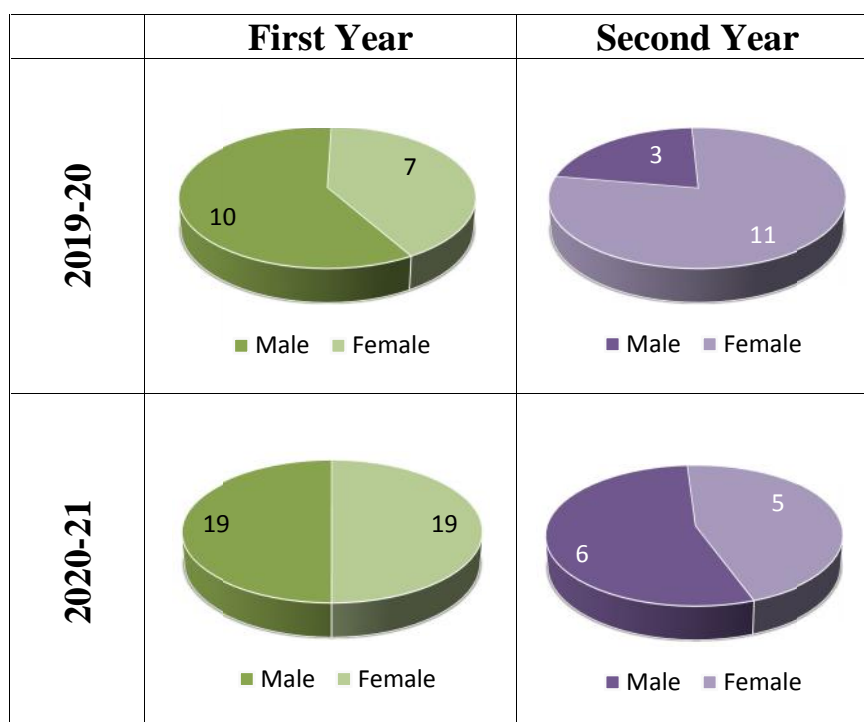
This is the presentation of gender wise comparison of the students admitted to the Bachelor of Arts program. As we can see the male female ratio is about 7:3 in the first year of the program but further in the second and in the third year it has progressed to about 3:2 and 5:4 respectively. It means drop out rate of male increases gradually upto the final year as compare to total number of students admitted to the program.

It also depicts that the percentage of success of the female students is far better than the male students in this program. As we see about 65% of female students have got admitted to the final year of the program as compared to male students that just about 30% have able to get through to final year. This is because the college has provided good educational facilities to female students so that they feel the ease and comfort to learn.

This is very important from the point of view that most of the female students admitted to this program are from tribal areas and having very poor economic and educational background. The college management has accepted this as a challenge and has taken initiative that encourage female students and all other male students those who belong to tribal areas. One of such initiatives is a Earn and Learn Scheme, which is very helpful to the students to earn for paying their fees and purchase study materials.

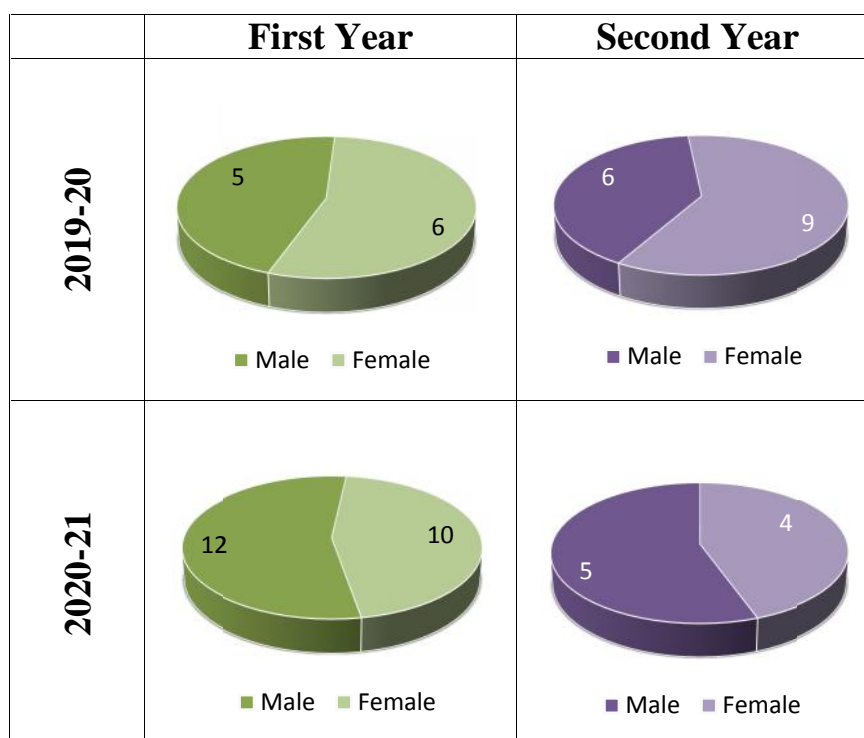
Along with four different under graduate programs the college has offered three post graduate programs namely Master of Arts (Economics), Master of Arts (Marathi) and Master of Commerce. 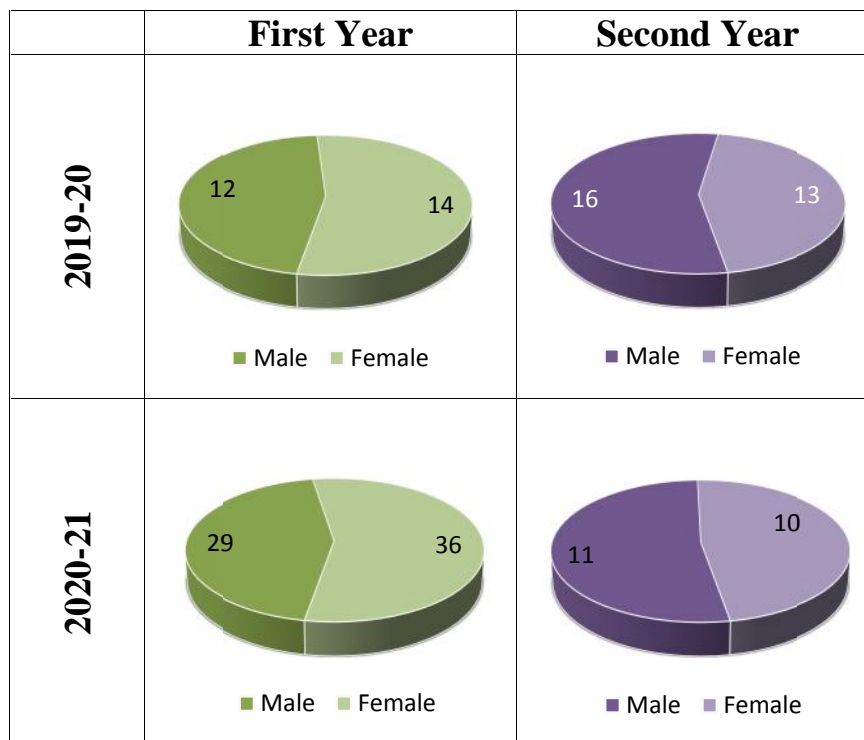

Recently few years back the college has introduced this new under graduate program to meet the needs of modern world. 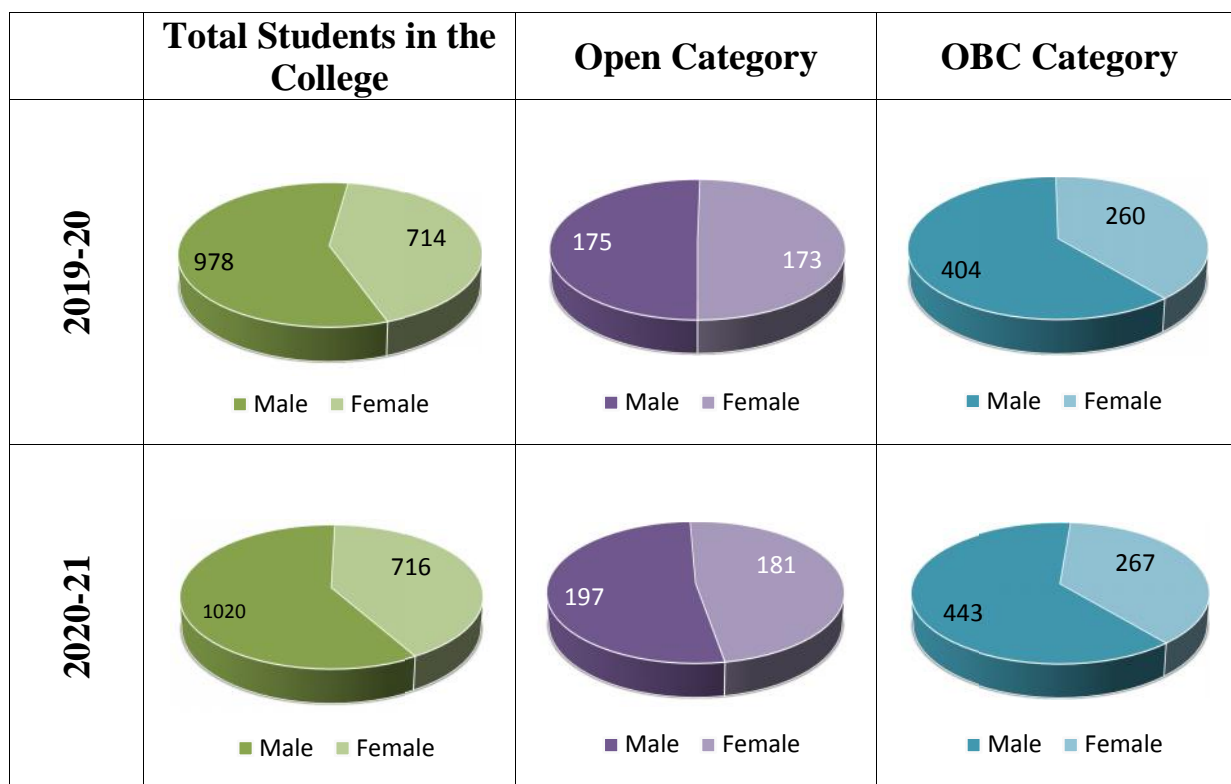

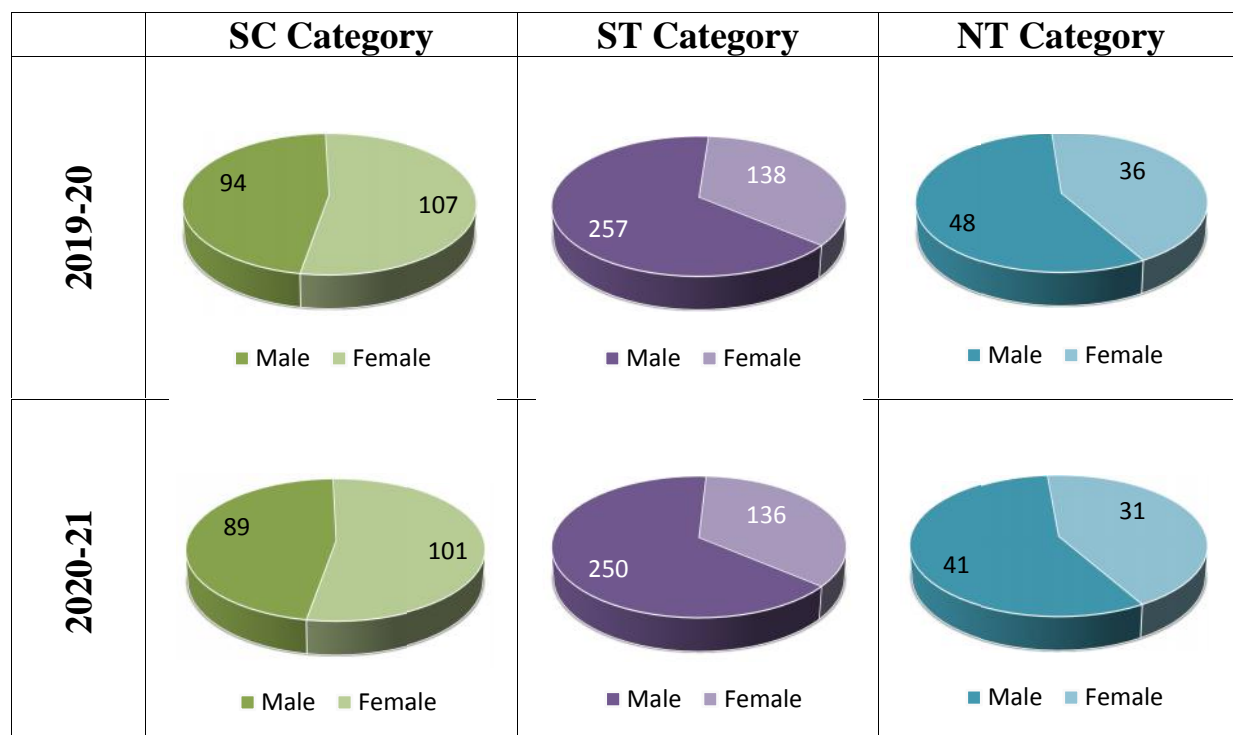

This is the graphical presentation of the total students enrolled to various programs in the college for the year 2019-20 and 2020-21. In 2019-20 female students were 42% and in 2020-21 it was 41% of the total students. In open caste category female students were 50% in 2019-20 and 48% in 2020-21 which is more than the percentage of girl students in the college. In OBC caste category the number of girl students is far less as compared with male students it is just 39% in 2019-20 and 38% in 2020-21.

Igatpuri is classified as a tribal region of Nashik District. There are many small villages scattered around the college. People living there are mostly belongs to scheduled tribes. It is worth to note that about 22-23% of the students are from Scheduled Tribes category. About 11-12% students belongs to Scheduled Caste category and 5% to Nomadic Tribes category.

Comparison of figures for years 2019-20 and 2020-21 shows that there is considerable consistency in the number of students in each of these three categories. The percentage of male and female in each category depicts that female percentage is more than male in SC category which is about 53%, in ST category it is 35% and in NT category it is about 39%. There is marginal change in the composition of male and female students in each category when the data for given two years is compared.

The College has 34 teaching faculty and 30 personnel in administration. The work culture of the college is very friendly for all. Staff has been provided with following facilities inside and outside the college.

- Each faculty is provided with department cabin with sufficient furniture and a computer with high speed internet access and continuous power supply. This adds to the higher efficiency of the staff.
- Sanitation facility- separate clean and spacious sanitation facilities are available in the college.
- Parking- Parking facility for the staff is separate from that of students' where sufficient space is made available for two wheeler and four wheeler vehicles.
- Recreation- staff can avail canteen facility apart from Tea Club. For better mental and physical health, staff is provided with excellent work out and sports facilities at college gymnasium.
- Tea club facility- With the small amount collected in the form of contribution per month from each staff, college runs a Tea Club Facility which provides beverages to the staff. Drinking water facility is provided in the pantry area.
- Sevak Kalyan Nidhi- Every person working in the institution contribute a fixed amount per month towards Sevak Kalyan Nidhi a staff welfare fund created for helping any member with financial help whenever required.
- Group Health Insurance- This is as an optional facility for each member working in the institution, a health insurance cover is provided to the person and his/her family at very low cost.

## 6. The Gender Audit Committee Functioning




## 7. External Auditor's Report




The following are the recommendations and suggestions for the further activities.


- Adequate facilities are being provided to the girls students like toilet blocks, separate parking facilities and encouragement in sports and cultural activities.
